The local currency is USD (United States Dollar). £1 will get you \$1.31 with the current exchange rate. However, the exchange rates fluctuate daily so it is good to monitor this before you head out off on your trip.

#### Visa Requirements

Before travelling to the United States with a British passport, you'll need prior authorisation. Most passport holders can get apply for an ESTA which allows travel to the US for up to 90 days. Most of the upper area of Key Largo is protected and home to the Crocodile Lake National Wildlife. You can also swim with dolphins, take a tour above or below the water, or tour the reef on a glass bottomed boat.

Key Largo Chocolates make quality chocolate and key lime baked products in their pink and green factory. The Pilot House Restaurant and Glass Bottom Bar allows you to dine over the water whilst spotting the local wildlife under the sea. Doc's Diner serves old fashioned American breakfast with pancakes, waffles, sandwiches and seafood.





Florida Keys Island Fest (mid-April): A popular event for more than 20 years, the festival features everything from live beachfront music to delicious Key's food, as well as a juried arts and crafts show and lots of activities especially for children.

Cuban America Heritage Festival (Key West, mid-June): This family-oriented festival has been running for over 150 years and it celebrates Key West's Cuban heritage. Expect cigar dinners, fiestas for kids, Latin jazz concerts and much more.

Key West Fantasy Fest (mid-October): The 10-day festival begins with the coronation of a King and Queen and continues with masquerade balls, costume competitions and plenty of other quirky events, ending with a 3-hour long parade on the last Saturday night.

There are several ways you can choose to explore the Florida Keys. Renting a car might give you more independence, however bear in mind that the Overseas Highway (the only main road in and out of the Keys) may be busy particularly at weekends and over holiday periods.

Park and Ride shuttles and taxis are available throughout the islands and we would recommend them. Busses are also available, with Greyhound running a Keys shuttle bus several times a day between Miami Intl. Airport and all major points along the Keys. Scooter rentals and cycling are also popular choices of transportation.
